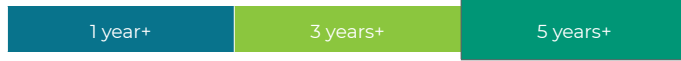

### ESG FUND RATING

The environmental, social and governance (ESG) fund ratings are based on the exposure of the underlying assets held to industry-specific ESG risks and the ability to manage those risks relative to peers.

### FUND OBJECTIVE

The fund is strictly managed in accordance with Shari'ah (Islamic Law) and therefore does not invest in shares of companies whose core business involves dealing in alcohol, gambling, non-halala foodstuffs or interest-bearing instruments. The Shari'ah Supervisory Board oversees adherence to the applicable Shari'ah principles. This fund specifically adheres to the standards of the Accounting and Auditing Organisation for Islamic Financial Institutions (AAOIFI) as interpreted by the Shari'ah Supervisory Board.

### WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

This fund is suited to investors with a long-term investment horizon seeking to maximise growth in a Shari'ah compliant fund. They are able to accept the risks associated with equity funds and also the mandate risk of a more limited investment universe.

### NON-PERMISSIBLE INCOME

Incidental income deemed to be non-permissible is paid to the charitable trust elected by the Shari'ah Supervisory Board in line with the principles of Shari'ah and the supplemental deed of the fund. Non-permissible income does not form part of the investor's income.

### INVESTMENT MANDATE

The fund is a Shari'ah compliant fund which provides investors with cost-effective access to a broad spectrum of local and international listed investments.

### REGULATION 28 COMPLIANCE

The fund aims to achieve long-term inflation-beating growth, and therefore may hold a higher allocation to equities than what is allowed in terms of Regulation 28 of the Pension Funds Act. This fund is therefore not Regulation 28 compliant.

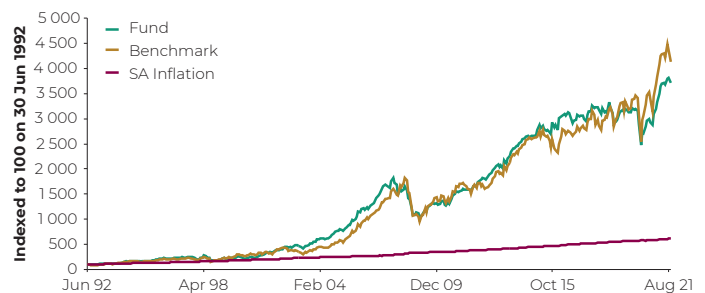

and materials, had a very different September, while quality lagged despite volatility.

The FTSE JSE All Share Index shed 3.14% for the month and 0.84% for the quarter. Resources and industrials fell 3.8% and 5.3% respectively, whilst financials gained 12.7% for the quarter. The resources sector was impacted significantly in September, due to concerns about the impact of the Evergrande debt crisis on commodity demand from China. The best performing sectors for the quarter were pharmaceuticals (65%, driven by Aspen), auto parts (36%) and chemicals (29%, mainly Sasol).

For the quarter, the local equity sleeve outperformed the JSE All Share Index. Nevertheless, this component was impacted negatively due to our exposure to resources (precious metals). The fund's holdings in platinum and gold were performance detractors for the period. We remain positive on the longer-term outlook for platinum. Considering gold at current valuations, our holding in AngloGold provides a highly attractive dollar cash flow yield, together with a measure of protection against systemic risks and inflation. We held no exposure to Aspen or Sasol, which were not approved for investment due to high debt levels at both companies. The fund's exposure to iron ore via African Rainbow Minerals and Afrimat also detracted from performance. In contrast,

our holdings in auto parts (Metair) and chemicals were performance contributors, together with MTN, Netcare, Alviva and Raubex. Whilst we couldn't hold any Sasol, the fund had exposure to global energy companies Royal Dutch Shell and EOG Resources, and locally to AECI, Bowler Metcalf and Omnia. Within our global equity component, the semiconductor and materials exposure detracted from performance, whilst Novo Nordisk (pharmaceuticals), Autozone (auto parts and servicing) and Fortinet (cybersecurity) were major performance contributors.

During the quarter, we initiated a position in Prosus, Europe's largest tech company and major shareholder in Tencent. Driven by investors' concerns around Chinese regulation, the share price has declined materially, providing long-term investors with an attractive entry point into one of the highest quality secular growth companies in the world. Excluding the listed and unlisted investments, the core Tencent business trades at approximately 15x forward PE (price-earnings). Ultimately, the opportunity on offer is to accept near-term uncertainty in exchange for longer-term growth. We believe that once the regulatory news flow slows down, the cash flows of the business will once again start to drive the share price.

## FUND COMMENTARY

Global equities fell in September, against the backdrop of higher bond yields, a weakening Chinese property market, and global supply chain issues. Japan was the best performing region on strong earnings expectations, while all other regions weakened. China weighed on Asia and most commodities. In September, higher oil prices supported the global energy sector and high bond yields helped banks, while tech underperformed. Volatility returned in September, with the S&P 500 posting its worst month in the post-Covid bull market (-4.7%). Two commodity sectors, energy
